Playing with James Abbott and his son Lewis, I saw an awesome display of teamwork, positive reinforcement and absolutely great golf. What a terrific score they had and what a great bond that comes from playing this very special and unique sport. As Tom Watson pointed out, there's no

other sport that provides the same opportunity to play and compete across all ages and abilities.

So back to Augusta as I watch a Master class, excuse the pun, in par 3 golf. Not as one might expect from the likes of Spieth, Johnson and Fowler, but from the veterans Nicklaus (76), Watson (68) and Player (82) who are today collectively 11 Under par after just six holes. All of them are in the top five, with three holes to play, against the current best in the world, who would be on average about 40 to 50 years perhaps younger. As I said above, what other sport can provide that sort of opportunity even without a handicap, to compete at such an elite level irrespective of age. Truly a unique sport.

And Wow it just got even better. Jack's caddy, 15-year-old GT and one of his 22 grandchildren, just scored his first and a terrific Hole in One. And Tom Watson at 6 under par, taking just 8 putts to complete the 9 holes, two of which were on the last hole. He has just become the oldest winner of the Par - 3 Masters Competition. Understandably Jack is choking back the tears of pride joy for his grandson's first ace. What a marvellous prelude to the main event.

So back to local activities and what a wonderful evening we enjoyed at the Men's Presentation Night! Congratulations to all those who took away a trophy and to my table mates for the Trivia Win. (Continued over)

TIME TO SAY GOODBYE? DO WE STILL NEED LINKS?

From the Editor

The *Links* newsletter is now in its 13th year of production. It had its origin in 2006, when I was first elected as a Director of the Club. At our first Board meeting, I was nominated as the Communication Director whose first task was to produce a monthly newsletter. Little did I realise that I would still be producing the newsletter thirteen years later. As we all know, over these last years, digital social

communication devices have escalated in number and form.



Links had a low key introduction in February 2006 when a 6 page document was produced, headed No Name Newsletter. In the first paragraph of this fledgling bulletin (pictured), I wrote –

This newsletter represents a new approach to communication in the Club.... New times require new ideas and it is hoped that this newsletter will more regularly address the need to keep both golf and social members informed about the range of events, functions, happenings, results and issues of concern and interest to the Lane Cove Country Club community. The newsletter will be produced monthly. Other communication improvements that are planned include making use of members' email addresses and, a little later, the development of the Club's website.

The name for the newsletter, *Links*, was selected following a competition for Club members to provide a suitable name.

For some years, *Links* was presented in print form only as an 8 page "booklet", but gradually, as more members acquired email addresses, we moved towards dissemination of the newsletter by means of email and the Club's website.

Utilising the technical skills of previous Club member, Karen Williams, I was able to establish the Club's first website. At the time, this seemed a significant step forward in communications, with bookings being able to be made online, handicaps able to be checked etc. With the assistance of Golf NSW, we are about to move into an updated third version of the website with improved uploading possibilities.

I am proud to say that, over the past 13 years I believe that I have managed to address the set of communication tasks noted above. My underlying principle has been to ensure that members were kept well informed with items of interest and concern. But, cliché as it is, *new times require new ideas*, and those forms of communication noted in the first edition, use of emails and the establishment of the website, have been joined by other social communication devices; for example, Facebook, which made its embryonic appearance in 2006, and soon following were others such as, Twitter, Skype, Facetime and Instagram, amongst many others.

As well, a few years ago, the Club began making use of Mailchimp on a weekly basis to deliver email messages about social activities, events and functions in the Club. This has become a vital of part of the Club's communication outreach. Members are advised in this way when *Links* is available on line. Members can also access it, and past editions, from our website at any time.

At the recent MGC Presentation Night I held a quick litmus paper test when the question was asked via a trivia quiz, if those present could name the person who appeared on the front page of the latest *Links*. Sad to say that only two of about eight tables were able to name Ian Cooper, jazz violinist and regular guest artist at Friday Night Music at the Club. Not a promising result. (*Continued over*)

The Women's Golf Committee currently makes extensive use of the OnegGolf website, via TeeTime, to deliver detailed weekly updated messages about golfing activities. The Men's Golf Committee is now making more regular use of emails to perform the same task. Do these messages need to be addressed again in *Links*?

As the editor, I very rarely receive any feedback from members about items in the newsletter, or *Links* content generally. That's OK. It comes with the territory and I am not asking for a pat on the back. But it is true to say that neither I, nor anyone else, has any idea as to whether *Links* is meeting the 2018 communication needs of the Lane Cove Golf Club community. Is it all wasted effort on my part as well as the time of those members who regularly provide most of the content for the newsletter?

Since 2006, it is very rarely, if ever, that I have used the first person singular pronoun to talk to my fellow members through *Links*. However, I believe it is time to make a decision about the future of *Links*, so it is over to you. As my headline says, is it time to say goodbye to *Links*? Do we persevere or is it time for *Links* to go? Has its function been superseded by other forms of communication? Has it become overtaken by more appropriate formats? Is it outdated? Irrelevant? Can what it does and has been done over thirteen years be done better in another way? Does it serve a different purpose from other forms of communication? Do you actually read *Links* in its present format?

Rules

incorrect score cards that are handed in at the end of a round. In the past we have sometimes let things go when we should have taken a tougher stance. Well, as you are aware, that is changing

During the last couple of weeks we have had to disqualify some players and teams for what is a lack of care when scoring. Sometimes the reason for the disqualification is a lack of knowledge of the rules.



Hopefully, members would be aware that there will be a lot of changes to the rules of golf to be introduced in 2019. So it is probably a good idea if we all learn and understand the current rules before we have to cope with changes next year.

The Men's Golf Committee has decided to give out a condensed version of the most common rules that most often need to be applied at Lane Cove. This version was originally developed by the WGC and has been refined by Graham Webster. Thanks to both for their work.

In the coming weeks this version will be given out with your scorecard. Please look at, read and try to understand these rules. (*Continued over*)

In particular, one rule to carefully consider is when you have to take a drop "at the nearest point of relief". So many players take the "nicest point of relief" and leave themselves open to disqualification if the error is not rectified.

Any problems please ask. Don't be a victim of carelessness that could cost you a competition win and the glory of your name in the paper.

- Painting of the external areas of the clubhouse has been completed with colours matching the internal colour theme. The finance for this activity to improve the appearance of the clubhouse generally, was provided from a Community Building Partnership grant from the NSW State Government. Thanks to our local member, Anthony Roberts for his help in our securing this \$19,800 grant. But particular thanks to Director Barry Watkin who was the man who did all the tedious but necessary paper work required to ensure success in gaining the grant. (picture left)
- * Also from the same grant, to improve disabled access to the clubhouse, money has been used to lay a new concrete path at the main entrance. (picture right)



* Barry was successful again in securing a \$2000 grant from Golf NSW to assist with the cost of the erection of a new buggy shed on the northern side of the clubhouse, such shed to allow for storage of motorised drive-on carts, together with other buggies. A cost of \$100 will be charged

for access to the new shed, and this of course includes use of power for battery recharging. Word has it that Barry is sounding out some other possible grant applications.

Many thanks to Mark Spence, who was responsible for the building of the new shed. (pictured left above) Not just a good golfer (Club Champion no less) but also a very accomplished handy man. Mark was on hand to help with the installation of the banner advertising Friday Night Jazz at the course entrance on River Road. Noticed it?

- * Toni Watkin, that family again, has been seen in several different places around and within the clubhouse, wielding a paintbrush. Thank you Toni. It's becoming quite a Watkin family affair around the Club.
- * That Watkin man again, the first to take advantage of the approval of the use of ride-on buggies on the course. The use of such buggies will enable members, who find the hilly course difficult to manage, the opportunity to continue to play golf, a thoroughly laudable development and in line with Lane Cove Council's mission statement regarding making sporting facilities more accessible for our ageing population.
