CAPTAIN'S CORNER

With our fields getting bigger over the last couple of months, an old issue has raised its ugly head



"That foursome ahead of us is still playing too slow. Fire a burst over their heads. Maybe that will get their attention."

SLOW PLAY!!!

For some reason, members seem to think four hours is OK for 18 holes at Lane Cove. Definitely, definitely not!

And, many members appear to be totally oblivious to the fact that they are behind where they should be in the field.

Even in the smaller fields of a Wednesday, groups can be 2 - 3 holes behind and offer the excuse, "We started 20 minutes behind the group ahead". So what!! Catch up and drag the groups behind with you.

One reason some post-competition presentations have so few members attending, is that the last couple of groups finish so far behind the field that the earlier groups have already had a drink and a 30 minute chat and have decided to leave.

Being just behind the group in front is the beginning of speeding play up. It is naturally up to the group in front to keep going and set the pace for the groups behind.

I won't go through the old slow play remedies, that have been aired many times, often falling on deaf ears.

Rather, I ask members to look at some different solutions to the perennial problem of **SLOW PLAY**. Try these for a start.

- 1. **"Ready golf"** is essential for all groups; i.e. play if you are ready. Don't wait for the player who's further from the hole and if that player is some distance from his ball.
- 2. **Don't unnecessarily mark your ball** on the green. Putt out instead.
- Take your head covers off once in a round, at the 1st hole. Put them in your bag until you finish.
 (You won't lose them that way)
- 4. **Always move forward**. If you have to go back to get your clubs, you have placed them incorrectly.
- Take as many practice swings as you want while other members of your group are teeing off. However, over the ball take ONE practice swing only. Believe me, at our level of golf, taking several practice swings isn't of any great value.

Let's make our great game enjoyable for all. There is nothing worse than being held up by the group in front.
