"Ian has performed with many big names from Don Burrows and James Morrison to Simon Tedeschi and David Helfgot, Tommy Emmanuel, John Farnham, even Silverchair, and international stars like Neil Sedaka, George Benson and Andrea Bocelli"

"He's as much at home playing Led Zeppelin as Mozart, Steely Dan as Mozart. One week he'll be on the stage at the Sydney Opera House, the next playing Irish jigs at the Hero of Waterloo in the Rocks appearing at the Manly Jazz Festival or leading Proms concerts in regional towns. LIFE MEMBER RON JEFFREY CELEBRATES 90 YEARS

Life Member Ron Jeffrey marked his 90th birthday recently, with a party at the Club. More than 80



relatives and friends, many from the Club, helped Ron celebrate this important birthday.

Originally from Western Australia, Ron and his family made the trip eastwards in 1970 so that Ron could continue working with the MLC insurance business. Perth's loss was our gain as Ron joined the then Lane Cove Country Club in 1972. This was an interesting time to be a member of the Club as Ron noted, "there was considerable tumult in the Club during the late 1970's – an autocratic president, a disruptive board and strained relations with the Lane

Cove Council, which owned the land. the

Club was in financial trouble and the Council had not renewed the lease. Ron together with Alan Price and Ken Davis as part of the Men's golf section managed to steer clear of the Board squabbling and effectively kept the Club afloat. The new Treasurer had been part of a 'palace revolution' that elected a new board."

Ron joined the Board as Treasurer in 1986, then Secretary in 1987, was Vice-President for two years and President 1990-92. In his 17 years as a director, Ron took over as secretary on two occasions to fill casual vacancies and was consequently licensee for a few years! Ron was President at the time of the Club's lease renewal with Council, a process that dragged on for two years (sounds familiar -the Ed)! Ron was Chairman of the committee which ran the first Charity Pro-Am in 1989.

As well as all the above, Ron found time to play golf twice a week. Included in his highlights; Gibson Shield player for over 20 years, C Grade Champion 2002, 4 Ball Champion, C Grade Foursomes Champion 7 times, 5 times in a row with partner Bruce Scott (Ed's note –I was on the receiving end of a losing match against this pair – almost unbeatable!) And to cap it all, three, count them, three, Holes in One. Ron continues to play 9 holes each week off a handicap of 23, and long may he do so. Congratulations Ron, a wonderful clubman and a richly deserved Life Member.

EXERCISE REGIMEN FOR PEOPLE OVER 60

For those of us over 60 - this is a great exercise regimen - for you young'uns out there (under 60), just keep it in mind until you reach that magic 60 number!

Begin by standing on a comfortable surface, where you have plenty of room on each side.

With a 2kg potato bag in each hand, extend your arms straight out from your sides. Hold them there as long as you can. Try to reach a full minute, and then relax. Each day you'll find that you can hold this position for just a bit longer.

THE CLUB SAYS FAREWELL TO THE POKIES

Thursday 1 March signalled the arrival of Autumn for 2108, and it also marked the last day that Lane Cove Golf Club provided access to poker machines in the Club.

At one time this reading work was carried out on a weekly basis, but more recently, a monthly reading and reconciliation only was needed, a very clear indication of the downturn in usage,
