Will was 5 over his handicap going into the last day and needed a very good last round to get back in the hunt. This success in our junior ranks was complimented by pro' Kasey Dive's Junior Development Program which has attracted 70+ new entrants, some of whom we hope will be joining Will as future Club members on completion of the introduction to golf coaching program. Kasey has also been successful in attracting 6 or 7 senior members through a similar program developed and supported by Golf NSW as part of a statewide initiative to grow our great sport. Good to have Kasey back again.

With the recent elections being a major distraction for Council and many of our Board members away recently, progress on the lease and BBT negotiations has been slowed but is now very much back on the agenda. The new Council appear to be pressing ahead with the 266 Longueville Road Development, which will fund the new precinct facilities, so we can anticipate the re-establishment of the Precinct Development Committee as a means to ensure stakeholder involvement in the planning process. We can expect more developments in this regard over the next few months, but Christmas and the January holidays are again likely to affect progress.

Both golfing committees held their AGMs recently and I congratulate and thank all those volunteer members who nominated to assist in the running of golf for our Club.

The WGC saw Yve Nickellys returned as President with Robyn Glover continuing the Captain's role. Welcome to new member of the Committee, Angela Charters and pleasing to see the return of Monica Cowper to management duties.

The MGC election saw Dave McFarlane step down as Treasurer after many years of service to the Club. A big welcome to three new members of the MGC, Dave Leckie, Ben Pearson and Alasdair Caush who will take over the bookkeeping duties. Brian Doherty and Wayne Belgre remain as President and Captain respectively.

The work done by these committees to ensure all goes well with our golfing activities is an absolutely essential part of the Club's operation. And sometimes not sufficiently appreciated by members who turn up each week for their golf without thinking about how and why things run so smoothly.

The planning committee are, I understand, looking at introducing some exciting changes to the event this year so it should be another great day out on the course with our mates.

A perhaps less exciting but nonetheless important event in our calendar, and again I'd encourage all members to attend.

A particular welcome to the newest committee members in David, Alasdair and Ben.




Our Mixed Visitors Charity Day, will be on Sunday 26 November....always a great day!

The results are as follows:


A Grade: Andrew Corish 63 and Scratch 75
