FROM THE PRESIDENT



Fellow Director Barry Watkin and I attended the first Recreation Precinct Advisory Committee (RPAC) Meeting on Tuesday 29th May organised by Lane Cove Council to allow contributions from the Club, other stakeholders and the broader community regarding the proposed redevelopment of the clubhouse, car park and tennis courts. Members will, I'm sure, be interested to learn more about the purpose and structure of this committee and how Barry and I will be representing the Club's interests in the exciting developments and improvements that Council are considering for the clubhouse and tennis facilities etc., and what if any impact this may have on our Golf and social activities.

The initial committee comprised two representatives from Council, three

community representative, including planning experts and Barry and I as representatives of LCGC. The process will involve an initial request for Expressions of Interest (EOI) from organisations to either develop and/or run all or some elements of the new precinct, which is expected to include multi-function sports capabilities along with the existing tennis and golf opportunities with bars, bistro and function centre venues as a community hub.

Depending on the outcome of this EOI process, Council then expects to engage with the interested parties to develop a more detailed brief for the tender process.

Accordingly, the final format of any proposed development, will not be known for some time and the redevelopment will be subject to a satisfactory completion of the current Development Application (DA) process for the adjacent 266 Longueville Road Site. Council expects this DA process will be concluded in June this year and therefore the EOI would only commence after that.

Whilst the exact details of the re-development structure will be determined through the EOI and Tender process, the proposed building is likely to be about 1800m2 and 4 storeys high.

Members with thoughts or concerns regarding the proposed development that they would like to bring to the attention of the committee are invited to contact the Club's Board of Directors who will then pass the enquiry or comments to the Club's RPAC representatives. *(Continued over)*

As I had observed on first meeting him, his IT knowledge and willingness to offer help and advice where needed, along with his kind, friendly and compassionate nature, was a consistent theme across the eulogies and Vale Nic Corish



speeches. What I and many others probably didn't know about prior to the service and wake, was his passion for cinema and TV and I for one, will certainly be taking Nic's advice and having a good look at The Sopranos, which was clearly one of his favourites.

Before he headed overseas, Nic and his father Andrew, were a regular pair playing in Club and inter-club competitions, and clearly, both enjoyed the opportunity to play together as a father and son combination. Like Nick and Andrew, before coming to Australia, I was fortunate enough to have enjoyed the same opportunity to play golf regularly with my father and I know how special that was for both of us and it will remain a fond and lasting memory. On behalf of the Club, I wish to express our sincere condolences to the Corish family and look forward to joining with our membership in remembering and honouring Nic through the Clubs' future activities.

On the golf front, many congratulations to Peter Siapos who achieved a sound win over yours truly in the Men's Singles KO. Peter has clearly played very well and consistently throughout the course of this event and is a worthy winner. I'm sure he will now definitely be one of the first picks for the Club's upcoming Gibson Campaign in the interclub pennants later this year, so watch out Woolooware, Rosnay and St George's River who are up against Lane Cove in the first rounds. Many thanks in this regard to Ralph and Ben who have both volunteered their time to be Managers of the respective Gibson and Warren teams this year.

And finally, the Board has recently received representations from some of our members regarding the condition of the course. The Board has written to Council to convey these valid observations and this continues to be an important area of concern for the club. Barry and I will be bringing these issues to the attention of RPAC as well. Hopefully, through the increased focus on the Club re-development process, we will be able to encourage Council to improve the level of maintenance for the course itself and bring the playing conditions back to a standard more consistent with well-maintained public golf facilities. *ALAN MOSS*


Mixed Foursomes Championship

Knee's up!


