

The idea is for members to empty their sand bucket to repair divots as they traverse the designated hole from tee to green. Also, pitch marks must be repaired as the group reaches the green.

The month of June hosts the most prestigious event on the Lane Cove calendar. Known as "The Fifth Major", the Mixed Foursomes is the most talked about and sought after event for the men. All the low markers played (with the exception of the two Andrews), which meant some fierce competition. 
