I hope you have all been suitably inspired by the convincing European Ryder Cup win over the USA and the return of Tiger Woods with his 80^a PGA win. A year ago, he didn't know if he would ever be able to play competitive golf again following back surgery and other injuries. However, once he recovered and was able to play without pain, he began to make inroads and play competitively. So, there's hope for us all as we recover from the aches and pains associated with winter.

Tiger's now only two PGA Wins behind the legendary Sam Snead (82 wins) so we should see some more exciting golf and huge tournament crowds on the box as he draws closer to this record and this win takes him to second place on the FEDEX Rankings for the year only 41 Points behind leader Justin Rose with 25 year old Cameron Smith the best placed Australian at 12th.

Also, of note this month is the record-breaking score of 59 (10 Birdies and an Eagle) in the Portugal Masters by Oliver Fisher who is the first player ever to break 60 on the European PGA Circuit. What a score and what great inspiration for our aspiring Club Champions for 2018.

CAPTAIN'S CORNER

It's been some time since I have talked about safety, but after some close shaves recently it is timely to remind members of their responsibility to play with safety in mind.

While members must be cautious not to endanger anyone on all shots there are two areas on the course



that cause most concern. They are the **shot to the 7th green** and the **tee shot on the 8th**.

Often when hitting to the green on the 7th hole, members cannot see over the hill. There is always a chance members having finished the 7th and walking back to the 8th tee are in the firing line. Before hitting to the green all members must ensure the group in front are well clear of any danger zone.

Also, having finished the 7th hole, members must walk towards the front of the 8th tee and not back up the 7th fairway.

The other problem area is hitting from the 8th tee to the 9th fairway. It is not good enough to hit over the trees to the 9th fairway and then call "Fore".

When walking up the 9th fairway it is very difficult to see the ball off the 8th tee and the chance of a ball ricocheting off a tree is highly likely. You must wait until the 9th fairway is clear if you intend to hit to that area. Remember, always, safety first!

To finish this month I want to remind everyone of two big events coming up. Firstly **Legacy Day** is on Saturday 24th November. Again this year the event of the day will be a 4 Ball Ambrose with some twists on the back nine.



The other important date is our **Presentation Night** on Saturday 1st December.

Both events are always enjoyable, so please make a note in your diary and help out a most worthwhile charity and help our winners celebrate a great golfing year.
