The day prior was miserable rainy and windy weather, but the golfing gods granted our wish and on the day the weather cleared to a fresh sunny day with a light breeze. What a course. The atmosphere and presentation were fabulous, starting with entry through a security gate not just to the course, but also to the whole community, which includes many mansions and I think three golf courses. Pebble Beach was in near perfect condition in preparation for the AT&T PGA Tour event next week. Rick and I will be glued to the TV reliving every shot we played.

The golf I have to say was almost as good as the course, with Rick and I managing a very respectable 49 points Best Ball which included a 5 point Birdy 4 for Rick on the second hardest hole. No doubt you'll all hear about this regularly over the next year or two.

As I successfully holed out from 30 foot over a massive double break for a par 3 on the 17th I could see the headline as I strolled past the spectator stands to the signature hole 18th Tee. "Lane Cove take on US top course and come up Trumps". The glory however was short lived as the mental aspect of the game kicked in. The daunting view from the tee presents rugged coast along the



left and OB into the course side mansions on the right. A lone oak tree centre fairway of the par 5 marks the target line. Unfortunately, our first two drives sailed majestically OB. Very safe from the ocean fail on the left but nevertheless no good. Mental note for next time: must check if the ocean counts as a lateral water hazard!!

Despite this initial fail, I invoked the new OB Rule and took a 2 shot penalty and continued from there, achieving a respectable 7 to conclude a very memorable day. Rick similarly managed a successful completion to the round from his provisional drive. Photo' opportunity of course - the Tee is near the green Camera Tower in the distance.

In summary, the course was great with too many fabulous vistas and approach shots to list but it also really showed me how tough our little course at Lane Cove is for Rick and me. But if you do get a chance, I would highly recommend a game at Pebble Beach as part of every golfer's Bucket List. Just make sure you're up to date with your Lane Cove sub's first, otherwise you might have to miss a year's golf at Lane Cove to recover the cost.


CLUB PIONEERS VALE, EDWARD (TED) JACOB, 1924 -2018

As members of our Golf Club in 2019, we may take for granted the access we have to a beautiful open green space, which is a wonderful community asset. What is not always recognised is that this green space which we enjoy today, was planned and built by a number of enterprising and visionary members in the 1960s, members who carved a golf course out of what was regarded at the time as a degraded, rubbish strewn valley.

Thanks to the old boys network of Ron Jeffrey, Laurie Sullivan and former member, Joe Gately, now residing in Narooma, the following is a tribute from Joe to one of these Lane Cove Golf Club pioneers, Ted Jacob.

Ted Jacob was an original member of Lane Cove Country Club and a Founding Director of the 14-member Club Board, as was Laurie Sullivan and the late Keith Edmondson, Bill's father, from 1962 – 1965.

Editor's note; as well as looking after golfing activities at this time, the Board had the responsibility of looking after the bowling activities of the Club, hence the 14 Board membership, with seven directors allocated to each activity. Bowls were played on two greens located where the tennis courts are today.



Ted Jacob served on Ted Cogan's Course and Greens Committee until 1964. They were responsible for construction of the initial Par 3 Nine holes, south of the valley at the back of 1st green, until the walkway bridge was built connecting Richardson Street West with Richardson Street East.

This gave a Par 27 layout enabling competition Golf to commence on Saturday 15° August 1964, and is now the current 1° , 7° , 8° and 9° holes of the existing course. *(Continued over)*

Then in 1965/66, Arthur Partridge, supervised by Joe Gately and Jim White, constructed the five holes north of the bridge at Richardson Streets. Play on the extended nine holes layout of Par 33 was opened on Saturday 10th September 1966.

Ted and his wife Lesley were keen golfers and played in the popular monthly Sunday Mixed 4BB fixture, which was a well-attended social event for many members. Lesley Jacob was elected Golf Associate's President in 1969.

The Jacob family and other early Club members contributed greatly to the community life of the Club with its steady increase of male Golf membership of 316, 232 Associates, 77 Juniors and Cadets, probably because the majority lived in the area of Lane Cove and adjoining suburbs.

CAPTAIN'S CORNER

What is the major issue that should be in the minds of most golfers at the moment?

Surely the 2019 rule changes should be top of the list. It is most important members understand the new rules and apply them properly before disaster strikes. By now everyone should have received a copy of the new rules of golf as well as a 1-page flyer explaining the 10 main changes to the rules.

Please read the new Rules Book or alternatively, visit the website <u>www.golf.org.au/newrules</u> to find an excellent explanation of the new rules so as to avert possible misunderstandings. During recent rounds we have seen numerous efforts by members to accommodate the new rules, but sometimes the application of those new rules has been "dodgy" at best.

We have been talking about the new rules for some time and what members must understand is that some changes are actual changes to the rules of golf and some are "suggested" changes to the local rules.

One actual rule change, and one easy to implement, is the method to use when dropping a ball when taking relief (either a free or penalty relief.). The ball must be dropped from knee height and not shoulder height as required previously. Should you not drop correctly, you will be liable to a penalty if you do not correct the error.



Another new rule that members seem to have trouble implementing is the reduced time to search for a ball. The time allowed has been



reduced from 5 minutes to 3 minutes. So from the time you get to the area where you believe your ball to be, you have 3 minutes to find it or it is deemed lost and another ball must be put into play.

One "suggested" local rule we have NOT introduced is where you can drop a ball (with a 2 stroke penalty) if you cannot find your ball that you believe came to rest in the general area of the course. Your only option if you lose a ball in the general area of the course is to play your

provisional (if you played one), go back to where you played your last shot from or, if playing stableford, wipe the hole and march on. So check out the new rules and please ask if you are not sure as to how to proceed correctly.
