For July, the women provided our winner with **Margo Anderson** posting two very good rounds of 31 and 34 to win with a total of 65 points.



EARLY HISTORY OF THE CLUB; COURSE CONSTRUCTION. Part 2 LAWRIE SULLIVAN and TED JACOB, with thanks to Ron Jeffrey

Up to this time (1964). the entire project was financed by the members or by a bank loan, which the members later paid off. There was no income in those early years, apart from debentures, which every new member had to purchase. The Board offered to pay out all debentures that weren't willingly donated to the Club, but as it transpired, probably 95% of debentures, with their interest, were donated to the Club. It must be said that for some years the members enthusiastically supported their new club and put it on a reasonably sound footing.

The plans were to first build a clubhouse and then plan for the course itself and the bowling greens. The major concern of financing the clubhouse construction was done through a bank loan guaranteed by Millers Brewery, conditional on serving their beer exclusively for ten years. The House committee became responsible for both financial planning and control of the clubhouse, its poker machines and its bar. The Clubhouse and the levelling of the site for the future bowling greens was completed well before the official opening, and even without any playing facilities, some income was generated. Once the Club House was opened, which coincided with the opening of the bowling green and the short golf course, it must be said that for some years the members enthusiastically supported their new club and put it on a reasonably sound footing.

The first bowling green was built by contract at the same time as the course construction was proceeding. The bowling green attracted many players and generated more income from its very beginning. A second green followed and the bowling section thrived and provided a steady use of the clubhouse and a steady income for the Country Club. But bowls gradually lost its followings and the two greens closed and the bowling membership merged with other clubs having similar difficulties.

Improvements were continuous right up to 1967 – it was a slowly changing layout with the improvements always toward the plan conceived by Ted Cogan and his committee in consultation with the greenkeeper. Where possible, working bees were used as soon as practicable and safe and this proved to be the best of the various motivation attempts – it was "our" course. Individual members would plant grass sow seed and even plant shrubs (in approved positions) all of which helped maintain interest. (Continued over)

It became apparent that a pro shop was needed so this was built by volunteers and a professional was engaged Doug Maggs was a good choice as our first pro, as he was a personable young man at the beginning of his career. He took charge of public bookings and generally ran the shop until later developments with regard to Council in regard to green fees forced some changes.

The "final" layout of the course remained final until 1974 when major improvements were made north of Richardson Street. Gradually both the course and the players improved. Alternate tees were built for the 2nd, 4th and 5th holes and alternate greens for the 2nd and 8th.

It was the nature of the early construction period that most of the involvement in the Club was limited to the Board but these men realised the need to keep the members in touch and enthusiastic and this was done by occasional social events and informative meetings.

Different times and different needs. But there is a great deal current members could learn about a level of support and participation in the running and welfare of our Club these many years after the pioneers built "our" course.
