The proposed Council Golf Precinct re-development planning is making some slow progress. The latest briefing included the following advice:

Council and AJ + C have undertaknen a process that has included AJ + C presenting a concept design encapsulating a range of issues and mandatory items as outlined in the original Expressions of Interest (EOI) document to Council's Executive Team (including the General Manager) on 9 October 2019.

Subsequent to the above presentation, and assuming approval, Council will then be in a position to engage with the Operators and Single (Sporting) Discipline participants identified in the EOI process shortly thereafter. (Continued over)

LIFE MEMBER KEN DAVIS

Died 26 November 2019

Life membership is a reward for exceptional service and Ken devoted most of his 36 years of active membership as a director and helping to run the Wednesday golf competitions and managing the poker machines meter readings and clearances.

His expertise was in the financial affairs of the Club, and although he was official Treasurer for an impressive five years, most of Ken's 16 years on the Board (1987-2003) involved the oversight of the strong position the Club was able to establish. It was a golden period of full membership and clubhouse

improvements. He was also Vice President in 1990 and 1991.

The Club no longer has poker machines, but for most of the 1990's the income from the pokies was the dominant factor, with annual profits of \$100,000 - \$170,000. This was a period before notes were used in the machines, and silver coins and then dollar coins were the playing options for gamblers. The huge volume of coins in the machines depleted the bar float to such an extent that most Saturday mornings, before the bar opened, Ken, with help from me and Bert Irwin, would often clear about \$2000 from the machines so that the barman had cash in the till for change.

Until about 15 years ago the Wednesday golf competition was always run by volunteers and Ken, Bert Irwin and Bruce Trethewey for a long time checked the cards, conducted the presentation with usually about 30 players present and then banked the collected fees into the Men's Golf Committee account.

Ken Davis was the ultimate club member. Dedicated, conscientious and a wonderful person either playing golf- which he really only started in middle age – or meeting socially. He would have made a great president but preferred a supporting role. Sadly, his last 3 years were spent in a nursing home.

Life membership was bestowed in 1996.

There were nine Club members at Ken's funeral on Friday 29 November and I was privileged to offer his family a tribute on behalf of the Lane Cove Golf Club, which he served so devotedly. He was aged 94.


- * One more Christmas Party to go.....Thursday 5 December
