CLUB RE-OPENING

It is with great delight that we advise that the Clubhouse is slowly but surely reopening. Initially, we will be opening on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays from June 3 as follows:

Wednesday; 3rd June 2020: 3.00pm - 6.00pm Saturday; 6th June 2020: 10.00am - 6.00pm Sunday; 7th June 2020: 10.00am - 6.00pm

And then every Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday until further notice.

We are fortunate that Dave Martin will be operating the Tee 4 Two BBQ Café on Saturdays and Sundays.

Opening up again brings with it a set of responsibilities for all of us. Covid-19 cleaning procedures will be adhered to and the number of patrons in the Club will be limited to 50, with social distancing mandatory. Throughout the Clubhouse, there will be hand sanitiser as well as soap and paper towels in bathrooms. When in the Clubhouse and on the deck it is important to be seated and not mingle while standing.



Another change is that from our re-opening on 3rd June 2020 the Club will be going cashless. This means that all payments at the bar are to be made by card. If this does not suit any member, arrangements can be made to have funds added to their account. The ATM machine will no longer be available.

We hope that we can extend the opening hours as restrictions ease and functions and gatherings can be accommodated.

The draft draw has Lane Cove playing Barnwell Park, Woollahra and Cammeray with the first round v Barnwell Park at home on Saturday 25th July. There will be more information about these events to come at a later date.

Best of luck to everyone in the upcoming events.




WOMEN'S GOLF

Saturday 30th May


Pete Doherty - 37 points. Barnsey added another string to his bow with another win, combining with Stu McDonald with a 47 best ball score.
