FROM THE BOARD



Thank you to all the members who attended the AGM on Monday 26th October. The meeting endorsed the nominations for the Board positions, with the result that the 2020/2021 Board is as follows:

Dermot Duncan – President Stuart Mc Donald – Treasurer Robyn Seale – Secretary Maureen Dunn- Director Barry Watkin- Director Barbara Oliver- Director Lucinda Brown – Director.

During the meeting there was much discussion regarding the precinct development. The meeting was updated on the actions so far, which focus on maintaining the golf course footprint.

Dermot and Barry presented at the October Council meeting via zoom, restating the Club's position on the development. Following the meeting, a new sub-committee has been established, to refine and present at the November Council meeting and beyond. The Board is keen to refresh our message and keep our opposition to any encroachment on the course in the front of Councillors' minds.

To date, no information has been received from Council on the results of the community feedback. We understand that the Council meeting on 16th November will be addressing the building. However, at this stage there isn't much detail on the building except that the current concept encroaches on the first tee, which we strongly oppose.

On other matters, we are no longer entitled to Jobkeeper payments for our bar staff, so we encourage all members to play more golf and support the bar. Matt and Ollie have left us to concentrate on other pursuits and we thank them for their contribution. We welcome Michelle to the team, who will be working a number of shifts during the week. Chris Taylor beat Mark Spence 3/2


B Grade
