As I sit here today, we have a golf course that had recovered sufficiently for us to resume regular golf and it really had been great to do so.

But what is it I hear outside? Sounds like the dreaded sound of rain on the rooftop. Well, I can only just hope it is not enough to take the course back to what it was for the last couple of months.

As I have been doing, I will continue to attempt to let everyone know about course closures etc as soon as I find out anything.

(Ed's comment – sadly, more and more rain since Wayne wrote this. The picture above shows the course on Saturday last, leading to closure until Wednesday next and probably after that as things look.)

Anyway, let's get on with some golf news.

We have had some confusion lately about the local rules in play for our Men's competitions. Since we got back to the course after the rains arrived, we only have three new additional local rules to those on the back of the card since we recommenced play after the wet. These are:

- 1 Preferred lie through the green
- 2 Bunkers in play with the exception of those with a white stake. Bunkers with white stakes are out of play and are to be treated as GUR
- 3  $11^{\text{th}}$  hole out of play play the  $2^{\text{nd}}$  hole twice.

These additional rules are printed on a sheet attached to the door of the Pro Shop. If you are not informed otherwise, these rules will be in play for some time, but please check the pro shop door before each round.

On other matters, the Singles KO has been progressing slowly and we are at last, up to the final. I have been lucky enough to make the final *(Ed's comment – luck had nothing to do with Wayne reaching the Final – well deserved!)* and I will play Andrew Reid. Just when – not sure – but Andrew and I will get it played as soon as possible.

The other event starting now is the 4 Ball KO. Again, the draw may be disrupted by rain but I'm sure everyone is aware they should try to play their matches as soon as possible.


### WELL DONE ALL
