VOLUNTEER GARDENERS WANTED



Now that we are back on the course, and as it begins to make a recovery from the big-wet, it would be great to have the gardens looking good too.

On Monday 8 August, three men and two women members did some work on the 1st tee and surrounding areas. This work mainly included trimming and clearing of the garden area. The result was a vast improvement of the water damaged garden. Picture attached left after the trimming of the geranium garden on the tee.

It showed what could be done to our tee gardens with a little loving attention and care. A wonderful example of what might be done is the Nik Corish Garden on the 5th tee, a garden looked after by the Corish "team/family.

I am wondering if people might like to form a small volunteer group to work as a team on a designated tee garden, to provide gardening maintenance as required. Depending on numbers, gardening could be done on a monthly basis or whenever required. That would be determined by the team.

The gardens I'm thinking about that lend themselves to such care are:-1st, 4th, 6th, 9th tee areas, and the club house garden.

For those that don't know, we are now in the middle of our representative season for B & C Grade Pennants, that is the Warren (not lower than 11.0 GA handicap) and Gibson (not lower than 17.0 GA handicap) Trophy competitions.

Jeff has detailed our results so far in his column, so I will let you know about our upcoming fixtures. We have two remaining home matches, against Bayview on Saturday 13th August, and against Palm Beach on Saturday 27th August.

It was a big month of golf (and travel) for Stone, who also played in the Combined Catholic Schools Polding Group Tournament at Blackheath and finished third.

Unfortunately, Stone was too young to be selected for the Polding team to play at the State tournament in Moorebank this September. However, Bertie will be there flying the flag for Lane Cove after being selected for the PSSA Sydney North team.

It was also a big month for another of our juniors, Lewis, who many members will know as a Saturday regular. Away from the course, Lewis has been turning his hand to the adrenaline-fuelled world of long drive. In late July, Lewis entered an indoor tournament (using Trackman) in Alexandria put on by the Professional Long Drive Association (PLDA) of Australia.

Lewis competed well, with his best drive topping out at 270 metres. To give you some idea of just how far that is - it's almost exactly the same as the distance from the back tees to the middle of the green on the fifth, eighth and ninth holes. Impressive stuff!

Finally, it's worth mentioning that Encourage Shield time will soon be upon us this October and we'll be looking to enter at least one Lane Cove team in the event.

With so many quality juniors coming through Kasey's school and into the Club, we're hopeful of putting on a good show in 2022 and helping more of our boys and girls enjoy this great sport.
