FROM THE PRESIDENT



We arrived home a week ago from our sunny winter adventure in Queensland, having driven 11,344 kilometres in 9 weeks and playing 12 golf courses along the way. I very much enjoyed playing at our course this week, despite the wet conditions, experiencing the familiar contours of the fairways and greens and of course, catching up with some of my member friends. While we played some interesting and challenging courses in Queensland, nothing beats local knowledge, especially on the greens.

I would like to thank Sharon, Barbara and Amanda for their great work in supervising the Club while I was absent. I also understand that we have had some very busy functions and post-golf gatherings and that our bar and café staff have been working very hard.

All members should be aware by now that the Council have approved their latest concept plan for the Multifunction Court Facility. Their funding plan for the \$72m project includes a NSW Government grant of \$5m for which they need to commence work by the end of June 2023. Thus, the Board have begun to assess the "to do" list to windup our clubhouse operations in that timeframe. It will be a big job.

The most important question for the Club is whether or not the course will be available for play during the construction period. When pressed on this question, the General Manager replied it would be up to the builder to decide on the basis of safety. Given that the builder is not likely to be appointed for some time, this perpetuates the uncertainty with which we have lived for many years now. The Board will continue to engage with the Council Officers and the Councillors to obtain more clarity on this issue and will report back any progress to members.

We are very close to completing our statutory annual reporting process and will be releasing the Annual Report before the end of this month ahead of the AGM on Monday 31st October 2022. Please put this date in your diaries now.



At the present time we are still trying to complete a couple of major events – the Singles KO and the 4 Ball KO. The Singles KO is up to the last match with Andrew Reid and myself to play the final.

The 4 Ball KO still has a way to go to finish and I must ask all those still in the event to plan your matches as soon as possible to try and have the event completed.

Obviously, the weather has thrown our golfing programme into disarray, but our main event (Club Championships) for the year is coming up in October, and we will hope to get through without any

disruption, weather permitting! This year we intend to play two rounds of qualifying (stroke) with the top eight players in each grade then going into match play.



Please remember if you cannot play in the match play section of the Championships, please let the Committee know before the draw is made to ensure you are not included.

As to which grade you play in, this is determined by your daily playing handicap (not GA) on the first day of the Championships.

You will play in A Grade if your daily handicap is 0-12, B Grade is 13-19 and C Grade is 19+



One thing members may be happy about is that the Council have planned to trim some of the trees during September. Work is due to start on Friday 9th September and continue for 5 days, 12-15 September. The work may impact some of our competitions, but I will let you know as soon as I know.

Of course, the plans may be thrown into disarray with the recent and forecast rains. Let's hope it can go ahead.

SMITHY - GOOD OR BAD DECISION? New York Golf Digest, September 2022



The question was whether Cameron Smith would add legitimacy to LIV Golf after leaving the PGA Tour and signing on as the World No. 2 and reigning Open Championship winner. While that may take time, one thing was immediately clear in Smith's first round on the lucrative rival tour—the mullet-wearing Australian adds considerable entertainment.

Smith shot a 64 to open the 54-hole event at six under par, one shot behind co-leaders Matthew Wolff and Talor Gooch. Smith wowed the Massachusetts gallery early with three birdies and an eagle in his first eight holes, before

falling down the leaderboard courtesy of a bogey, a birdie and a double bogey in his next six.

At the par-4 16th, Smith hooked his drive into the trees, then faced a left-handed shot against a tree. Because of the cart path in his adopted lefty stance, he took relief and then played his next shot as a right-hander. A roped hook wedge helped Smith save a rollercoaster par. "My gap wedge was a little bit worse for wear after that one," he said. Smith then drained a long-range eagle at the par-5 18th.

Smith and LIV's five other new recruits, including Joaquin Niemann and Harold Varner III, have faced criticism from major winners Gary Player and Fred Couples this week for defecting to a tour that features 48-man fields playing no-cut, 54-hole tournaments. Player said LIV was "never going to compare to the regular [PGA] tour".

But six-time PGA Tour winner Smith said he didn't feel any added expectations in his first 18 holes with LIV. "I don't think it was any added pressure; I just wanted to go out there and do my thing," he said. "At the end of the day, we're all competitors and we're trying to do what we can."

The fourth LIV tournament of its eight-event debut series began Friday with chief executive Greg Norman parachuting onto the first hole and music blaring—efforts by LIV to create its own identity.

"That was something that I haven't experienced before on the first hole, but it was cool," Smith said. "It was just a good way to start a tournament. [Today] kind of had a bit of everything; it was very up-and-down. It probably wasn't one of my best driving performances. "I feel like the crowd out there is almost on top of you, with the music. It feels like the course has a bit of a heartbeat. It was very different, I would say, but something that I really enjoyed, and I can't wait for this to keep going onwards and upwards."
