On Saturday 17th September, Lane Cove Council conducted a session at the clubhouse to consult with the community about the most recent concept plan for the redevelopment. It was pleasing to see that the plans include a "golfers' lounge" for post competition socialising as well as a home for our honour boards and trophies.

The attendees communicated their concerns and requests by post-it notes which were later documented by the Council officers. 
The practice nets are once again available for use, although there is still further remediation work planned in the next month to allay safety concerns.


